A Different Kind of Offering...



Offerings during worship services at Kotela parish, Our Savior's sister congregation in Tanzania, are somewhat different from what we are used to. For one thing, there are no ushers who pass offering plates. Instead, individuals come forward themselves to place their offerings of money in baskets at the front of the sanctuary.

Many of the worshipers, however, simply do not have coins or bills to offer. These people bring items from their homes or gardens to place at the altar. At the conclusion of the worship service, the congregation gathers outside on the steps of the church where the items are offered for auction. The money garnered from this auction is added to the cash offerings of the day.

The Tanzanians bring a variety of items for their offering, and each item has value and use in their society. One might see a stalk of sugar cane, three or four ears of corn, two or three eggs, a homemade basket, a bouquet of flowers, mangos, bananas, a container of coffee beans, a piece of material, etc. Whatever is offered is truly a sacrifice for the giver.

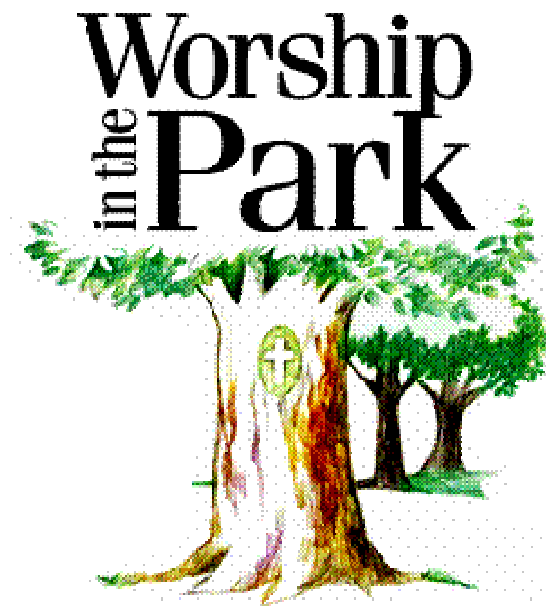
