Dear Friends in Christ Jesus,

Interim pastors are known as *faster pastors* because we do not have the privilege of getting to know our congregations well before we do serious work with them. Loren Mead in his book *Critical Moments of Ministry* talks about this serious work that interim pastors do. He lists five areas of focus. They are: Coming to Terms with History, Discovering a New Identity, Allowing Needed Leadership Change, Strengthening Denominational Ties, and Commitment to New Directions in Ministry.

I would like to bring to your attention one of these important tasks. Coming to Terms with your History is one of the ways interim pastors help congregations establish and maintain a healthy life. All of you know that for a congregation to prepare for its present and future it needs to come to terms with its past. I feel that a congregation that does not understand its past and has not come to terms with its past will repeat it. We see this happen in all kinds of situations today. From our government on down to our daily lives, if we do not learn from our past we surely will repeat it. For example that might mean: putting the tenure of the last and former pastor(s) in perspective, acknowledging the past and accepting the "good and the bad", deciding what is important and worthwhile to carry into the future, or even the appropriate ventilation of feelings, grieving, accepting, and finally moving on.

During the months of March and April I will be holding small group meetings giving you an opportunity to reminisce, listen, and share stories about your church. Sharing stories about Our Savior is one of the most important things we can do!

We all know that when you have a personal crisis, you need to be connected with your family for care and support. So too in the church. This is one way we can begin to connect with each other about the past and future of this church. Let us strengthen our sisters and brothers in faith, and let us be strengthened by them.

Transitions are always difficult times. Even when filled with excitement and hope, change is stressful. Let us care for one another well during these days. Let us be patient with one another, speak kindly to and about one another, and most importantly, support one another with prayer.

You have been called to live as a Christ's people in the promise God made to you in your baptism. Let us always remember whose we are.

"Pull Up a Chair"

Last week I read a story in *Group Magazine* that really made me think about my prayer life and the prayer life of many in our congregation. Prayer has really been a struggle for me; either I don't know what to pray about or I don't know how to talk to God or I just don't make time.

The story was about a youth leader who was terminally ill. This youth leader had an antique chair that sat next to his bed. Many just assumed that it was meant for visitors, but a few weeks before he passed away he shared with a member of his church why the chair was special to him. Apparently he had been having difficulty praying as well. He felt that his prayers weren't getting anywhere so eventually he just stopped praying. He did this until a friend told him that he was making prayer more complicated than it needed to be, that prayer is just like having a conversation with a friend. So he put a chair next to his bed and imagined that Jesus was sitting there and conversed with him. Prayer became easier, such that he would spend hours talking to the chair in conversation with Jesus.



The story makes me wonder how each of us makes prayer much more complicated than it really needs to be. While it is always good to take time to pray, it can be as easy as just sending a friend an email to let them know how you are doing or how sometimes you need to have a good long talk with a friend to work out a situation or ponder an event. All that God wants us to do is nurture our relationship with him like we would a lifelong friendship. It is a challenge to always keep connected to friends and it can be a challenge to make time to talk to God, but if we pull up a chair and say hi it may get easier for all of us.

My Trip To the Dentist

I recently had an abscessed tooth over a weekend. The pain started on Friday night well after the dentist office had closed, of course. I decided to take some Tylenol and tough it out until Monday morning. By Sunday afternoon I was in more agony than I can ever remember and my face was



swollen up like a balloon. I finally went to the hospital Emergency Room that evening. After all their poking and prodding, I was actually in MORE pain than before I got there. They gave me antibiotics and stronger pain killers than just Tylenol. I felt some relief in a few hours. Monday afternoon I finally got in to see the dentist. Though the pain had lessened, it was still there. I hate going to the dentist and I was deciding to just leave and let the pain killers and antibiotics take care of me. I was scared of more pain. But I knew I had to face the dentist and get the abscess taken care of before it caused me more harm. After two long hours in the dentist chair and 4 shots of novocaine, the dentist finally extracted the offending teeth. Not one but two. Thankfully, I had remembered to take more pain killers just before I got to the dentist office. The trip home from Sioux City to Wayne seemed to take forever. I was in even more pain than after my trip to the ER. I didn't know if I could bear it any longer. Luckily I got home and was able to take the extra pain medicine the dentist prescribed. Within a few hours I had an amazing amount of relief and was even able to go to the worship and music committee meeting that evening. It's Thursday now and though there's a little bit of it remaining, the majority of the pain and swelling has gone down and I'm no longer on pain killers.

What does my trip to the dentist have to do with church you may ask? Simple. There's pain in our congregation for a number of reasons. No one is to blame. Pain just happens when we live together. I want to remind us that while that pain can feel unbearable at times, our natural pain killer, God, will watch over us and help us to heal. Sometimes we have to face that pain head on and extract the offending teeth before we can finally find relief. It's a long process; one that isn't going to happen over night. Sometimes there's more pain before there is finally relief and the pain sometimes hangs on longer than we'd like before it finally diminishes to nothing. At some point, we find that we no longer feel the pain and wonder when it finally went away.

As we embark upon our interim with Pastor Bob, I'm sure there will be pain. We may have to do some surgery on ourselves and there may be times we're not sure we can make it. Pastor Bob is going to ask us some tough questions that we're not ready to answer. He's going to ask us to face our pain head on. But if we trust in God, we will make it through. Blessings to you as we face our future together knowing that in Christ, we can do all things.

A STEWARDSHIP MOMENT...

WHERE ARE YOU?

Have you ever asked yourself that question? Perhaps more recently than you would like to admit. "Where are you?" is the first question God asked Adam in the Garden of Eden (Genesis 3:9). Adam responded, "I heard the sound of thee in the garden, and I was afraid." How would you have responded?

Some may respond in terms of family affiliation, location or vocation. But God is asking why Adam and Eve are hiding in the garden. God learns how his instructions have been disobeyed- "... but of the tree of the knowledge of good and evil you shall not eat" (Genesis 2:17). This first encounter lays a foundation for the relationship between God and the people he created.

Like Adam and Eve, we too have been given much. We are asked to be caretakers of this world. And by God's grace, all that we need will be provided. We are asked to baptize and teach in the name of the Father, Son and Holy Spirit. Yet, where are we? Where are we in our relationship with God? Are we hiding in the garden or standing on the mountaintop praising God's name?

Our relationship with God is personal. This faith relationship is nurtured by reading the Bible. Our faithfulness also develops certain attributes. In his book *In Search of Faithfulness*, Lutheran layman Bill Diehl suggests seven attributes:

1. Building a Sense of Identity – We do this by building our relationship with God and recognizing our calling by God. Each of us is called to a ministry.
2. Growth – We are constantly changing and facing new challenges. The Bible serves as a daily guide for the content of our belief, but we must also experience our faith, or put in to practice what we believe. This combination shows us how the teachings of Jesus apply in everyday life.
3. Prayer and Meditation – This is how we communicate with God and keep a clear sense of God's will in our life. Simply take time for prayer.
4. Life in Community – We each live in three communities – universal, the congregation, a relational or support community. Each

plays a role in our growth and building a sense of identity. How we worship with and serve others provides a witness to our faith.

5. Giving – Faithful people are marked by their willingness to give to others. This may include their time, talents and resources.
6. Sense of Justice – This involves applying the Christian values we learn to ethical issues we face in daily life. Accepting Christ means accepting certain responsibilities and fulfilling them to achieve desired outcomes.
7. Simplicity of Life Style – As people of God, we put God first in our life. Our security is in our faith, not our earthly possessions. We set our priorities based on God's will, not our own.

Where are you in your relationship with God? Are you hiding in the garden? Each of us have these seven attributes to different degrees. It is by recognizing, developing and practicing them that we will grow in our faith and build a stronger community at Atonement. Let's do so together!



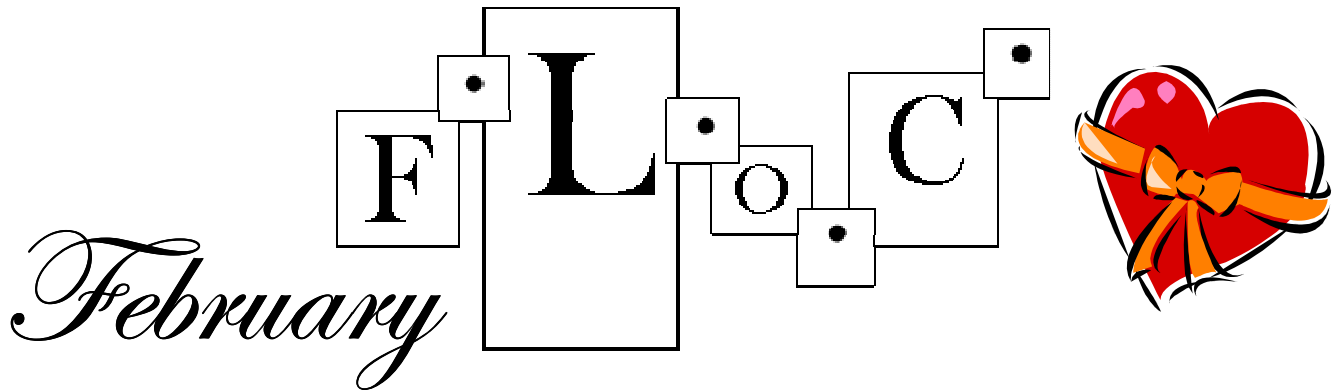

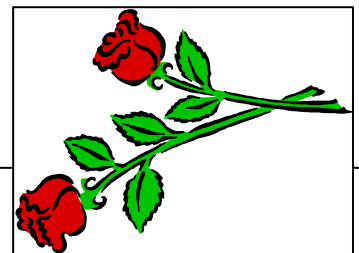

Discussion of the kitchen cabinets was tabled until the February 8th meeting, when we hope to have a couple more bids in.

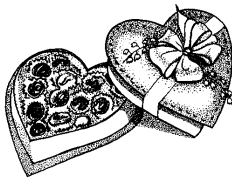
Decorations for the tables in the Narthex was discussed. Thank you Phyllis for the Valentine decorations.

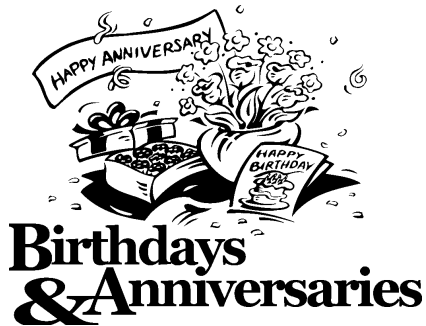

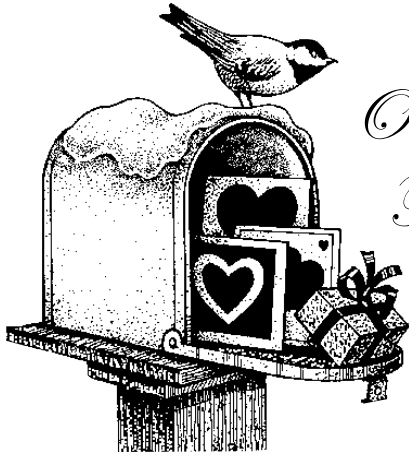
